HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

South Australia was an Australian territory that experienced less prosperity compared to the eastern coastal territories. Its main source of income was agriculture, which faced many challenges due to the aridity of its terrain. It is distinguished from the other territories by being the first to grant women the right to vote in 1894, and was the home of Catherine Helen Spence, the most influential woman of that time. Its administrative center was located in Adelaide.

This political status remained until January 1, 1901, when the Commonwealth of Australia was created, incorporating this territory and others that formed a federation of states. This marked the beginning of the use of postage stamps designated "Australia," with the first issues appearing in 1913.
